Weaving

Beginning Weaving \$150/\$0

Class fee covers loom rental and materials for the first two projects. Students will purchase yarn for one project. This class starts with warping the loom. We will also cover plain weave, twills, figuring how much yarn to use and caring for cotton yarn. We will weave two samplers and a project of your design. We will use a four-shaft table loom so you will be able to work at home. All skills transfer to floor looms.
